Power gives our children and teens a safe place where they find role models and support. Together they grow as caring, imaginative, and bright young people, discovering the best of who they are, their sincere selves, while helping their peers to do the same. ♦



Building on our Success: Expanding Adult ESL

Last year, almost 300 adults attended Providence Center's ESL classes. They came looking for better jobs, the chance to help their kids with their homework, and the hope of finding new friends. With experienced instructors led by one of our founders, Sr. Peggy Doherty, we were blessed to help our students succeed.

Our students on average improved their English abilities over 22% when tested on their reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills. Those gains came after just 36 hours of instruction over 12 weeks, prompting us to wonder *what if we provided even more class time?*

We are now increasing our classes from 1.5 to 2 hours, giving our students 50 hours of instruction each

Providence Center has a long history of working with high school students as Teen Leaders in our after school program. Now that we have five of our previous Teen Leaders enrolled in college, we're starting a Graduate Leader program! These college students will continue to work in our after school program, helping to mentor the children and Teen Leaders while receiving support as they pursue their educational dreams. ♦


