A Letter from our Executive Director



As I reflect on our many accomplishments over the last several months, I can't help but feel overwhelmed with a wide range of emotions. I am proud of Providence Center's ability to pivot so quickly in the midst of a nationwide pandemic. I am grateful for the generosity and support of donors like you that make that possible. By the same token, I can't help but feel the weight of the many uncertainties that we face today, as an agency and as a city. Now more than ever, I can't help but worry for the families and children that we service who are disproportionately being affected by COVID-19.

This pandemic has brought to the surface the many inequities that communities like Fairhill endure, highlighting issues such

as food insecurities, the technology divide, disparities in healthcare and the fact that many of the city's essential workers are under-paid and largely comprised of minority workers. These inequities are not new, and make no mistake, they affect the residents of Fairhill every single day.

The tragic murder of George Floyd has also brought the worst injustice of all, racism, to center stage. To mourn the death of George Floyd and the many others who have lost their lives simply because of the color of their skin isn't enough. We have to work harder than ever for Fairhill. Our mission is to serve the needs of the Fairhill community, and they need us now more than ever. We must stand strong behind the message that "Black Lives Matter".

Through a partnership with Philly Counts and On the Table Philly, our YA! (Youth Advocates) teens have been working to increase census participation in the Fairhill community. They are the youngest group in Philadelphia to attend training to be come Census Champions! YA! teens are worked in our neighborhood to explain the importance of the census and assisting community members in filling out the survey.

Throughout quarantine, they also participated in phone banking efforts in order to continue this important work. Providence Center has also hosted census job fairs to encourage Fairhill residents to work for the census and take advantage of this opportunity to ensure a more complete count this year. Our Philly Counts census awareness work will continue throughout the summer months.

We are thankful to announce that we didn't have to suspend our ESOL programming due to COVID-19. Our ESOL teachers and many of our students transitioned to virtual classes to complete the semester. Our summer semester of classes will be 100% virtual.
